1. A notice of cancellation is sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, or other form of mailing that provides proof thereof, to the address specified in the public adjusting contract, and;

2. Such notice is provided within 30 days from the date of loss due Hurricane Milton, which made landfall on October 9, 2024, or 10 days from the date the contract was entered into, whichever is longer.

3. You may also cancel a public adjuster contract without penalty or obligation if the public adjuster fails to provide you or your insurer with a copy of a written estimate within 60 days of the execution of the contract, unless the failure to provide the estimate within that timeline is caused by factors beyond the control of the public adjuster, as provided in section 627.70131(5)(a)2., Florida Statutes.

Accordingly, I am hereby cancelling the contract for public adjusting services entered into on the _____ day of _____, 2024. This Notice of Cancellation is made effective by operation of section 626.854(7), Florida Statutes. Be advised that this Notice of Cancellation releases me from any financial obligations provided in the Public Adjusting Contract.
